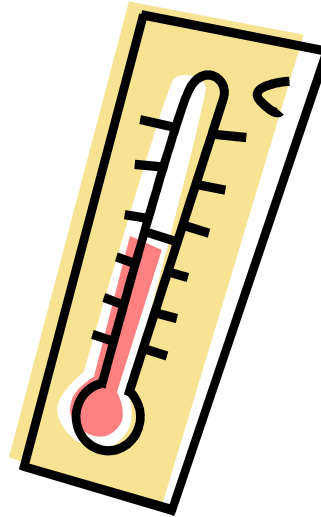


Heat and Cold Related Emergencies

Signs of Hyperthermia in Dogs & Cats:

Temperature over 104°F
Vigorous Panting
Dark Red Gums
Tacky or Dry Mucus Membranes
Lying Down and Unable to Get Up
Collapse or Loss of Consciousness
Thick Saliva
Dizziness and/or Disorientation



Signs of Hypothermia in Dogs & Cats:

Depression
Lethargy or Weakness
Shivering
Stupor
Muscle Stiffness
Difficulty Breathing
Fixed and Dilated Pupils
Low Heart and Respiratory Rate
Coma

Hyperthermia: Above normal body temperature

Normal Body Temperature for DOGS: 100.5°F to 102.5° F

Hypothermia: Below normal body temperature

Normal Body Temperature for CATS: 100°F to 102.5°

If an animal's body temperature gets too high or too low, serious health problems can occur. Get your animal treated by a veterinarian immediately!
