

Minutes of the Historic Preservation Commission

Call to Order: Chair Masters called the meeting to order at 3:05 pm.

Roll Call of Commission Members: Chair Masters, Vice Chair Eichelberger, Commissioner Bennett, Mobraten, Venturino, and Zink are present. Staff present: Donna Phillips.

Flag Salute: The flag salute was led by Chair Masters.

Introduction of New Commissioner: Gavin Mobraten gave a brief background and lives right around the corner [from City Hall] on Orchard Avenue. His family has been here about 15 years and recently moved into downtown City of Hayden and he wanted to get involved. He is actively involved in the Chamber, Senior Center, Rotary, and is an employee of the US Bank in commercial lending. He was originally from Los Angeles and then to Seattle and now resides here.

Introduction of Visitor: Nancy Morris came to see what the Commission is doing, as she was one of the original members of the Board. She was involved when the Commission was trying to save the log cabin (the Steele cabin). The Historic Preservation Commission has worked for years to preserve the cabin in its current location or in a future yet to be determined location. It is one of the oldest and best preserved buildings in the area. There had been some hope for it to go to Stoddard Park, but then there was some discussion of development of the current site. Discussion ensued regarding the cabin and possible move as a whole or tearing it apart and then moving the building.

2. **Unfinished Business**

- a. Hayden History Book Volume II – Commissioner Bennett gave an update of her research (attached).
- b. Hayden History Book Volume I – Vice-Chair Eichelberger gave a recap on the edits for the book. There seems to be a little tidbit in every family that may be great to have an inset that described what it was. So as an example, in the Frank family it talked about the steamboats and in the House family it identified a diamond knot. Examples, we have three families in the CCC's, or the Hutton Settlement, Rock sled, etc. that would be used as insets of just some information. Heather Callahan from Coeur d'Alene is related to the Casey's. What about outhouses? Commissioner Venturino or Nancy Morris will provide a photo of an outhouse. Discussion ensued as to the placement of the diamond knot and where it was placed during packing activities on horses.
