

ORDINANCE 69-1 1ST AMENDMENT

Roll Call: All present

Sup. Bosscher moved, supported by Sup. Remington to amend Ordinance 69-1 to read as follows:

WHEREAS THE CHARACTER OF Missaukee County is undergoing change because of increased population pressures, and

WHEREAS some undesirable development has taken place within the county and

WHEREAS, unguided haphazard growth and development can react unfavorably on the physical, social and economic well being of Missaukee County,

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that Missaukee County Board of supervisors by this ordinance, declares to proceed under the provision of Act 282 of the Public Acts of 1945 as amended to institute study and surveys toward the formation of a comprehensive development plan for the County, and provide for zoning districts within which proper use of land and natural resources may be encouraged or regulated by ordinance and to formulate such other regulations as fall within the scope of this act as will promote and sustain the general welfare of the people of Missaukee County.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that there is hereby established a County Planning Commission consisting of five members, whose duty it shall be to commence forthwith to initiate and develop the objectives stated above.
