LOCAL PUBLIC ART DEDICATED

Three new pieces to bring joy to residents

The **City of Wylie** has dedicated its three newest pieces of public art, “Prairie Crossing” and “Entwine” by Michael Szabo, and “Lift-Off” by John Davis. The dedication was hosted by Mayor Eric Hogue, the Wylie City Council, the Public Arts Advisory Board, and the Parks and Recreation Board. Szabo’s pieces are positioned at either end of the hike-and-bike trail on the Wylie Municipal Complex Campus, and Davis’

piece is located in Oncor Park, 961 E. Brown Street, at the nine-hole Frisbee Golf Course.

Szabo’s two designs, “Prairie Crossing,” a 50-foot-long web of stainless steel and bronze arches, and “Entwine,” are a tribute to Wylie’s tenacious spirit, which he compares to the hardy prairie grasses. Davis’ piece, “Lift-Off,” elicits the spirit of the flying discs that surround it on the Frisbee Golf Course.
