City receives 26th straight financial reporting award

The city of Wylie was awarded the certificate of achievement for excellence in financial reporting by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada for its comprehensive annual financial report for fiscal year 2013-14.

The award marks the 26th consecutive year Wylie has been honored with the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting.

"We are proud of our finance staff's commitment to excellence in reporting and to transparency," city manager Mindy Manson said. "It is an honor to receive this award for the 26th year in a row."

Reports submitted to the CAFR program are reviewed by selected members of the GFOA professional staff and the GFOA special review committee. The committee is composed of an impartial panel of public-sector financial statement

preparers, independent auditors, academia and other finance professionals. The CAFRs are judged on a set of standards, including their ability to demonstrate a constructive "spirit of full disclosure," effectiveness in communicating the entity's financial story and ability to motivate potential users to read the CAFR.

The GFOA established the certificate of achievement for excellence in financial reporting program in 1945. The goal is to encourage and assist governments to go beyond the minimum accepted accounting principles and prepare CAFRs of the highest quality, according to a stringent set of guidelines, and to recognize individual governments that succeed in achieving that goal.

The GFOA is a nonprofit professional association serving approximately 18,000 government finance professionals.
