Plano City Council considers clothing recycling deal

Plano could become the first city in Texas to collect smelly shoes, torn shirts and threadbare socks for recycling.

The city is considering partnering with a company that finds a second life for worn-out clothing and small household items that are often tossed in the trash.

"The value of that material is one of the highest in the waste stream. It makes sense to capture it," said Adam Winfield, president of Ohio-based Simple Recycling, who recently presented the clothing recycling program to the Plano City Council.

The service would be provided at no cost to the city or residents, who would place these unwanted goods in free bags provided by the company. The bags would be collected on residents' regular recycling days.

Winfield said used clothing and textiles are "virtually 100 percent recyclable" and can be shipped to other countries for resale or repurposed as cleaning rags, insulation, carpet padding and other uses.

If the Plano City Council approves the agreement in July, he said, it would be

the first city in the state to offer this supplement to its recycling program.

Collin College founding trustee Tino Trujillo dies

Fortino Pineda "Tino" Trujillo, best known for his Tino's Mexican Restaurant and Cantina, was also the quiet bridge-builder for numerous civic and business projects in Collin County.

Trujillo, 82, died in his sleep last week at the home of his sisters in Colima, Mexico.

A memorial will be held at noon July 9 in the conference auditorium at Collin College's Spring Creek Campus, 2800 E. Spring Creek Parkway in Plano. He was a founding trustee of what began as Collin County Community College.

Trujillo was among the earliest supporters of a community college for Collin County, said Bob Collins, a fellow founding trustee. Trujillo was a leader among the volunteers who obtained signatures to bring the issue to a vote in April 1985. He was elected to five six-year terms to the college board of trustees. He stepped down last July.


Wylie City Council re-appoints Stephens mayor pro tem
