

RECAP: Author facing another felony charge

Best-selling sports author Jim Dent faces a new felony charge. The 62-year-old Dent was indicted May 7 in Williamson County on a charge of bail jumping and failure to appear. The new charge was recorded Tuesday at the Collin County Detention Center, where Dent has been held since Feb. 15. The indictment on the third-degree felony charge stems from Dent's failure to appear at his sentencing hearing in February 2014. He had pleaded guilty to driving while intoxicated after crashing into a toll-booth along State Highway 45 in Austin on Jan. 18, 2012. The charge is the latest legal trouble for the author of such sports books as *The Junction Boys* and *Twelve Mighty Orphans*. Dent has 10 DWI convictions that span four states and more than 30 years.

Harvest America sets date for AT&T Stadium outreach

Harvest America, the evangelical outreach that drew about 20,000 people to American Airlines Center in October, was hoping for a much larger crowd in November for its planned return to the Dallas area, this time at AT&T Stadium in Arlington. It turns out the National Football League had other plans, scheduling Cowboys home games on both dates that Harvest America had suggested. Instead, Harvest America will live-stream the Gospel outreach across the United States on March 6 from AT&T Stadium, three weeks before Easter. Harvest America is led by California pastor and evangelist Greg Laurie. "After months of planning and praying and preparation, we are excited to finally have an official date for this historic event," Laurie said. "Local church leaders agree this is great timing for Harvest America, during the Lenten season and leading into Easter."

Architecture, urban affairs are merging at UTA

The University of Texas at Arlington's long-standing schools of Architecture and Urban and Public Affairs are in the final phase of integration to become the new College of Architecture, Planning and Public Affairs. The University of Texas System Board of Regents approved the creation of the new college Thursday.

The college will incorporate six professional degree programs: urban planning, public administration, public policy, architecture, landscape architecture and interior design. All faculty will be in the existing Architecture Building on the main UT-Arlington campus. The new college fulfills an early initiative of UT-Arlington's Strategic Plan 2020: Bold Solutions | Global Impact and is an advancement toward the university's focus on enhancing quality of life in large urban regions. During the next year, the college expects to introduce new certificates in areas such as historic preservation and urban design.


EULESS Vanderveer band to play Monday night at library
